

CapeNature GOUKAMMA NATURE RESERVE AND MARINE PROTECTED AREA





Time slips through your fingers at Goukamma Nature Reserve - the passage of the day is marked by the tides, the crashing of the waves, and the lapping of water at the edge of the lake. From the tea-coloured water of the Goukamma estuary, to the limpid green of the Groenvlei lake, the reserve is a hymn to the power and beauty of water. It is one of the Western Cape's most significant Marine Conservation Areas, providing a safe haven for a variety of indigenous and endemic species. The ancient milkwood and coastal vegetation exert a different but equally compelling pull: after a day on the water, visitors can retreat to the soothing dark of the forest. Living in the forest means sharing it with the creatures who got there first, and guests will quickly get used to the sight of a vervet monkey peering through the window. CapeNature offers a range of accommodation and activities, giving visitors the opportunity to learn the rhythms of this beloved stretch of coastline.



To Goukamma and Buffalo Valley:

From Cape Town, take the N2 highway and travel for about 500km south towards George. Roughly 40km past George and between the towns of Sedgefield and Knysna, take the turn-off to Buffalo Bay. Follow this road for 8km and then turn right (towards the river) and into the reserve.

To Mvubu Bush Camp:

Approximately 2km east of Sedgefield (between Sedgefield and Knysna) on the N2, turn right at the signboard "Lake Pleasant" and continue past the caravan park. The road swerves to the right and becomes a gravel road. Continue with that road \pm 1.7km until the first turn-off to the left with the signboard that says "Groenvlei/Mvubu Bushcamp". Follow the jeeptrack until you get to the gate of Groenvlei. The gate key is on your disk.

SELF-CATERING ACCOMMODATION UNITS

Mvubu Bush Lodge is situated on the western side of the reserve, on the edge of the Groenvlei Lake. This elevated wood and thatch self-catering lodge is nestled in milkwood forest, offering spacious accommodation for four guests in two en-suite bedrooms, one with double bed and the other

Three charming self-catering chalets overlook the Goukamma River, each with two bedrooms. One bathroom (shower & toilet) is shared between the two bedrooms. Blacktail is situated in the middle of the three chalets which are at least 80m apart, but not secluded.




OTTER'S REST LODGE

Set overlooking the ocean and river, the lodge sleeps four in two rooms with the main bedroom featuring a double bed, and the second bedroom two single beds. One bathroom (bath, shower & toilet) is shared between the two bedrooms. An open-plan kitchen, dining room and lounge provides a space to relax and enjoy a crackling fire in the indoor fireplace. The main area opens out onto an expansive deck with braai facilities. Private parking is available.





This duplex unit is located on the top floor of Otters Rest Lodge and sleeps two people in single beds. The loft has fabulous sea and river views, and an open-plan kitchen, dining room and lounge leading onto a deck with private braai facilities. The en-suite bathroom, with skylight, has a shower. Private parking is available.


BUFFALO VALLEY Self-catering accommodation units

Buffalo Valley is a large conservation area bordering the serene Goukamma River just two kilometers upstream from the warm Indian Ocean. Buffalo Valley's three self-catering timber lodges each offer privacy, are fully equipped and sleep between four and six people.

THE THREE LODGES HAVE THE FOLLOWING AMENITIES:



Overlooking a tranquil birdvlei, this magical hideaway has a deck designed around milkwood trees. The living area with its huge fireplace has a character all its own. Linger around the fire at the spacious outdoor braai area. Fall asleep to a chorus of frogs and wake to the sounds of the singing birds.





Hidden in riverine forest right on the edge of the Goukamma River, the spacious sky lit Forest Lodge has a magnificent deck built around bird-filled milkwood trees where you can relax as the river glides by. Follow a short boardwalk to a private jetty from which you can fish, canoe and swim.
